Duncan Steele MA, PMP, MHA(c)

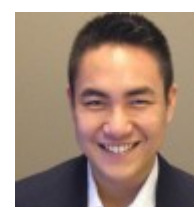
Ethicist, System-Level Ethics, Fraser Health Authority

Emily Rose, BASc, MHSc, MPH

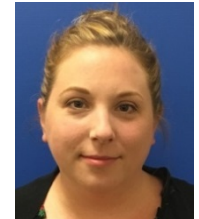
Human Factors Specialist at Vancouver Coastal Health Quality & Patient Safety
