

A patient experience

Mr. A was admitted to the ward with an indwelling catheter. He told us that the GP had inserted the catheter for a swollen abdomen some 18 months previously. Since that time Mr A said he had suffered a recurrent UTI whenever the catheter was changed.

According to his wife having the catheter "Ruined his life for the last 18 months"

" Indeed he spent Christmas at home as he was afraid the bag would leak"

The IPC team and ward staff could find no record of a formal referral to the urology service and so the rationale behind the catheter was unclear. Following HOUDINI principles the catheter was removed and Mr A passed urine normally and was discharged without a urinary catheter.


For me, it's not the target, it's not about having five, four, three. It's not about having a number. It's about having none. That's what's important. That no patient suffers any harm from the result of our practice. In terms of how I try and motivate and drive my teams, that's exactly the take that I...it's about hearts and minds. It's about telling them stories about patients who have had horrendous times and it's been because of the weakest link in our chain letting them down. It's about motivating them in that way to want to do no harm. *(Matron, Surgery MRSA target reduction)*

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Hindsight


- The ability to reflect and learn from the past
- Requires us to see the events of the past with ‘new eyes’ to uncover what we missed at the time.
- We tend to develop fixed models of what is happening and then fit events into those models.

Ebola in hindsight...

- There is no point having boots and eyes on the ground if you do not listen to them
- Real time diagnostics are increasingly essential
- Communication must be swift, effective and culturally sensitive
- We need surge capacity to respond to global epidemics
- Knowing what has happened in the past has to be used to inform foresight




2006 – Foresight

Eight classes of disease that are important in the next 10-25 years

- New pathogen species and novel variants
- Pathogens acquiring resistance
- Diseases that cross between animal species to humans
- HIV/AIDS Tuberculosis and Malaria
- Epidemic plant diseases
- Acute respiratory tract infections
- Sexually transmitted diseases
- Animal disease that cross national boundaries
