Viral Respiratory Illness (VRI) entrance screening tool

For health-care facilities

This tool is for screeners at health-care facility entrances to determine whether an individual poses a VRI risk and whether they should be permitted to enter. This tool should be used in conjunction with provincial policies as well as any employer workplace health and safety (WHS) policies. This tool is an example and can be adapted based on specific settings or services and is not intended to replace medical advice.

** Designated visitors are those who are essential for the patient's wellbeing or are part of the care team (e.g., parent/guardian of small children). Consult with care team as needed





During viral respiratory illness season, all persons entering a health-care facility must follow provincial requirements.

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
